



#### **College of Distinction**

UW-Whitewater was selected as a 2023-2024 College of Distinction, a national honor that recognizes campuses for exceptional teaching and dedication to student success. UW-Whitewater ranked as a Public College of Distinction, an Equity & Inclusion College of Distinction, an Affordable College of Distinction, a Career Development College of Distinction, a Business College of Distinction, and an Education College of Distinction.



#### **U.S. News & World Report**

UW-Whitewater ranked No. 43 among regional universities in the U.S. News & World Report 2023-2024 rankings, and is ranked 11th among Midwest regional public universities. This year the university was also recognized for advancing social mobility, as a best college for veterans, best value school, best undergraduate teaching, and for its outstanding business program.

#### **First-to-Second Year Retention Rate**

The retention rate of first-year bachelor's degree-seeking students who started at the Whitewater campus in Fall 2022 is 77.5%.

The retention rate of first-year associate degree-seeking students who started at the Rock County campus in Fall 2022 is 62.9%.

#### **Veterans**

The UW-Whitewater Main and Rock County campuses serve a veteran population of over 375 students. Thirty-seven percent of this population are enrolled as graduate students, including 14 doctoral students.

#### **High School Student Enrollment**

UW-Whitewater enrolled over 350 high school students in Fall 2023. Over 75% of these students are enrolled in the Partners in Education (PIE) program, which allows students to earn college credit while still in high school.

# **Students with Disabilities**

The Center for Students with Disabilities serves over 1,300 students each year - undergraduate and graduate students on both the Main and Rock County campuses. Eligible students receive many types of accommodations to support their academic success.

UW-Whitewater offers 2 Associate degrees, 7 Bachelor's degrees, 5 Master's degrees, and 1 Doctoral degree

In 2022-23, UW-Whitewater awarded 2,665 degrees, including 172 Associate degrees, 1,860 Bachelor's degrees, 614 Master's degrees, 11 Education Specialist degrees, and 8 Doctoral degrees.
