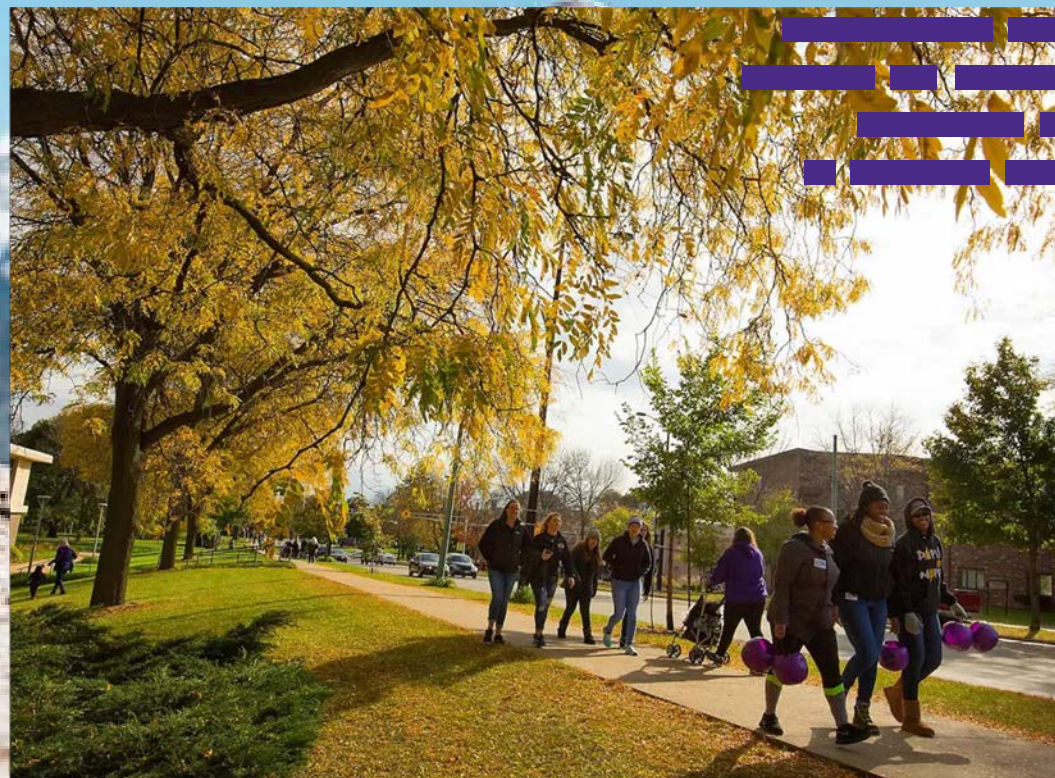

HALLOWEEN PARTY SAFETY TIPS:

CARRY-IN POLICY

Items permitted: bags no larger than 8.5" x 11", binoculars, cameras, blankets, jackets, items related to a medical condition, chair backs (not more than 16" wide), and diaper bags (with child).

Items prohibited (including, but not limited to): bags larger than 8.5" x 11" (including backpacks), food, beverages, containers, strollers, laser pointers, umbrellas, banners, flags, signs, noisemakers, weapons, inflatables, video recorders, or any items deemed dangerous or inappropriate.

Storage facilities are not available for checking prohibited items. Items left at gates will be disposed of accordingly.

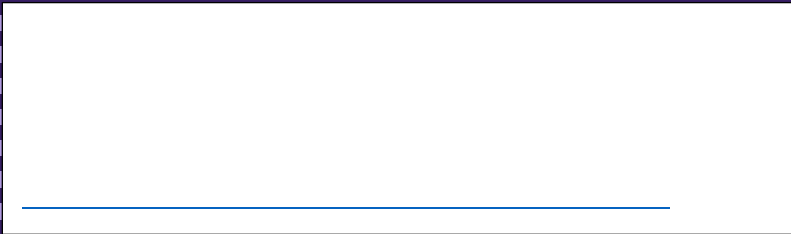
Halloween costumes may be worn in Perkins Stadium, but the costumes must be able to fit into a normal seating space and must be of an appropriate nature. No additional carry-ins will be allowed as part of a Halloween costume.

ITEMS PROHIBITED

- NO BAGS LARGER THAN 8.5" x 11" (INCLUDING BACKPACKS)
- NO FOOD OR BEVERAGES
- NO CONTAINERS
- NO STROLLERS, NO UMBRELLAS
- NO LASERS, NO VIDEO RECORDERS
- NO FLAG, BANNER, SIGNS
- NO NOISEMAKERS
- NO WEAPONS
- NO INFLATABLES

ITEMS PERMITTED

- BAGS: No larger than 8.5" x 11"
- CHAIRBACKS: Not more than 16" wide
- JACKETS & BLANKETS
- BINOCULARS & CAMERAS
- DIAPER BAGS WITH CHILD
- ITEMS RELATED TO A MEDICAL CONDITION



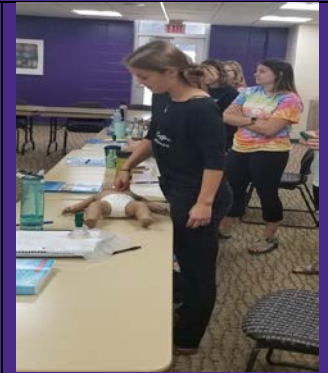
UWHPD IN ACTION

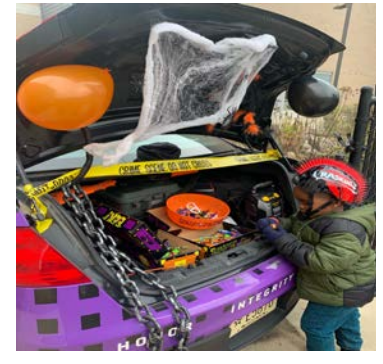

LOCK YOUR DOORS AND KEEP TRACK OF YOUR VALUABLES: DON'T INVITE CRIME INTO YOUR LIFE!

OF ALL OF THE THEFTS THAT HAVE OCCURRED AT UWW SO FAR IN 2019:

- 42% RESULTED FROM PRIVATE PROPERTY BEING LEFT IN PUBLIC PLACES, AND THEN STOLEN.
- 21% RESULTED FROM LEAVING THE DOOR TO A ROOM OR VEHICLE UNLOCKED.
- THESE TWO AREAS ACCOUNT FOR 63% OF ALL THEFTS SO FAR IN 2019!

OF ALL OF THE THEFTS FROM RESIDENCE HALL ROOMS AND VEHICLES THAT HAVE OCCURRED AT UWW SO FAR IN 2019: 75% RESULTED FROM LEAVING THE DOOR UNLOCKED.

NATIONWIDE, ALMOST 30% OF BURGLARIES ARE COMMITTED BY THOSE WHO ENTER THROUGH AN UNLOCKED DOOR OR WINDOW!
