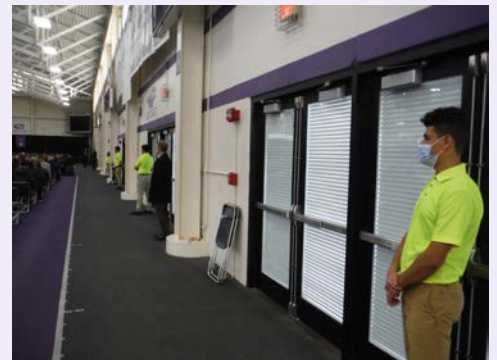

Fun Facts: What to do if you are involved in a motor vehicle accident.

You accidentally strike a vehicle while pulling into a parking spot. You and another vehicle accidentally back out of your parking stalls at the same time and strike each other. You lose control on ice and hit a traffic sign. You get into an accident with a University-owned vehicle while working. What do you do? See below for the best steps to take after being in an accident.

- **Remain calm.** Check yourself and others for injuries. If medical attention is needed right away, call 911 for EMS.
- In a minor accident, **if both parties are present and agree**, you can exchange insurance information with each other without calling the police. Accidents can be self-reported using the link at the bottom of this section.
- **All accidents involving University owned vehicles need to be reported** to the University Police by calling 262-472-4660.
- If a report is needed, or there are any questions, call the University Police at 262-472-4660 to report the accident. An officer will be able to tell you if the accident is reportable.

Fun Facts: Tornado Facts in Wisconsin

The Wisconsin Statewide Tornado Drill is coming up quickly.

According to the National Weather Service, there have been 1,537 documented tornadoes in Wisconsin since 1844, causing 511 directly related deaths and at least 3,056 directly related injuries.

2005 was the year with the greatest number of tornadoes, ending with 62!

According to the most recent data for Wisconsin, June is the month where the most tornadoes happen.

The worst recorded tornado in Wisconsin happened on June 12, 1899 in New Richmond, killing 117 and injuring 125. Over 300 buildings were destroyed.

Do you have a plan in place to shelter in the event of a tornado warning?

Remember the below important information about tornado watches/warnings:

Tornado watch: Be prepared, a tornado is possible.

Tornado warning: Take Action! A tornado is happening or is about to happen.

Fun Facts: Safety Tips to Remember

April is [Sexual Assault Awareness Month](#). With that in mind, here are some safety tips to remember and put into practice to increase your personal safety.

1. **Know your resources!** Who should you contact if you or a friend needs help? Where should you go? Locate resources such as campus emergency phones and the university police department.
2. **Stay alert!** Be aware of your surroundings. Invite a friend to come along with you when you are out and about, especially at night. If you are on campus or adjacent to campus and are worried for your safety, you can call UWWPD at 262-472-4660 to request an escort.
3. **Make a plan, and stick to your plan!** If you are going to a party, go with people you trust. Watch out for each other and leave together. Don't leave your drink unattended, and watch your friend's drinks if you can.
4. **Always have a backup plan.** If your phone dies, do you have a few phone numbers memorized to get help? Do you have emergency cash in case you are unable to use a credit card? Do you have the address to your residence hall memorized?
5. **Lock up!** Lock your door when you are asleep and when you leave your room. If people prop open the main door to your residence hall or apartment, report it.

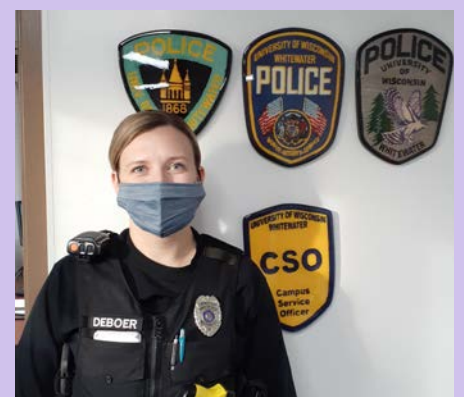

At the end of June, UWWPD's two full-time administrative staff attended the Law Enforcement Administrative Professionals Conference in Oshkosh. They were able to network and connect with other UW Campus Police Department Administrative Staff, along with others from departments all over Wisconsin and as far away as Alaska!



In early June, two of UWWPD's newest officers were trained in Emergency Vehicle Operations and Control (EVOC). Using classroom instruction and scenarios, EVOC training instructs and teaches UWWPD sworn personnel in the areas of:

- UWWPD's individual pursuit policies
- Basic EVOC skills on the driving course
- Steps for conducting a high-risk traffic stop at the end of a pursuit
- Steps for conducting pursuits that end in a parking lot between vehicles
- Pursuits with two subjects in the vehicle
- Pursuits where Stop Sticks are deployed.

Airsoft guns are utilized for the trainings and all participants wear safety gear (such as eye and face protection).

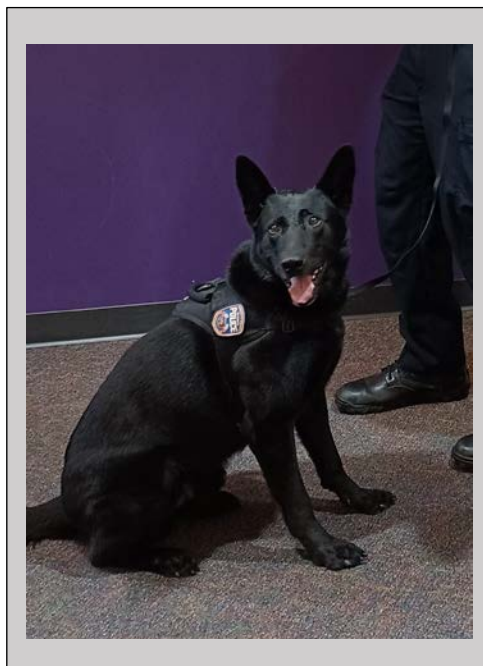

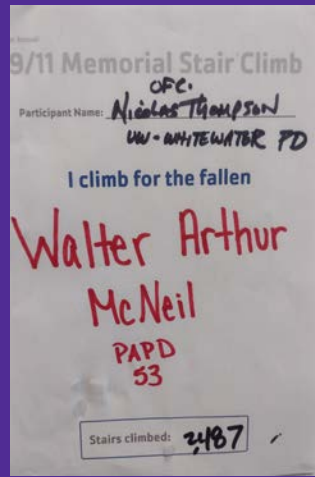

At a recent conference, administrative employees from UWWPD were able to meet and network with a dispatcher and a records specialist from the City of Whitewater Police Department.

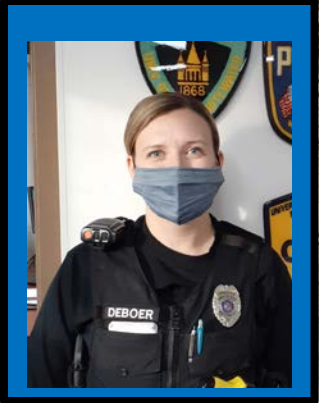
The City of Whitewater Communications Center also dispatches for UW-Whitewater, and it was a great opportunity to meet and learn more about each others' agencies.
