1. Purpose of Articulation Agreement

This program-to-program articulation agreement between the Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College and the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater (UW-W) allows students to be awarded 45 credits toward a B.S.E. degree in Early Childhood Education (Certification in EARLY CHILDHOOD REGULAR EDUCATION and EARLY CHILDHOOD SPECIAL EDUCATION) if they meet the following criteria. The students:

- 1.1. started an A.A. degree program in Early Childhood Education (ECE) within the Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College in the Fall 2016 semester and beyond.
- 1.2. have successfully completed such a program.
- 1.3. have applied to and are successfully admitted into UW-W.
- 1.4. have been admitted into the Early Childhood Education Program.

2. Articulated Courses

The 22 credits will be assigned in a block equivalency and via individual course-by-course equivalencies as described in the tables below.

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3. General Education Requirements

- 3.1. The UW-W baccalaureate candidate must also meet UW-W's General Education requirements.
- 3.2. The maximum number of credits that can be transferred from collegiate transfer institutions to UW-W is 72.

4. Admission to Professional Education

Admission to UW-W does NOT guarantee admission to the professional program in the UW-W College of Education and Professional Studies. Admission into the UW-W College of Education Professional Education Program is based upon the student's successful completion of academic and non-academic criteria determined by the College of Education and Professional Studies. These criteria are as follows:

- 4.1. Completion of 30 degree credits (transferable Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College plus UW-W credits).
- 4.2. 2.75 combined cumulative grade point average on transferable credits (it must be emphasized that 2.75 GPA is the minimum and does not guarantee acceptance into the College of Education and Professional Studies).
- 4.3. View the [Phase 1 and 2 online video meeting](#) and pass the accompanying quiz in D2L.
- 4.4. Completed applications and test scores (if applicable) must be submitted by the posted deadlines on the COEPS Admission webpage.

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Additional Conditions

- 4.5. Program to Program transfer courses/credits are accepted only for the degree specified in this agreement. A change of major invalidates these courses/credits for transfer unless they are approved within some other Program to Program Articulation Agreement for a different major at UW-W.
- 4.6. UW-Whitewater College of Education and Professional Studies will accept Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)/Work Experience credits from Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College for students transferring to UW-W with an A.A. Early Childhood degree. The grade for the course will be accepted as assigned by the institution administering the degree. When transferring to UW-W up to 9 credits of CPL/Work Experience can be accepted towards the Program to Program Articulation Agreement in Early Childhood Education.
- 4.7. Course equivalencies specified in this articulation agreement are subject to change in the event that the course curriculum of the Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College Early Childhood Program or UW-W undergoes revision.
- 4.8. Degree must be posted on official transcript to receive credits from the agreement.
- 4.9. If either party seeks to terminate this agreement prior to its expiration date, the terminating party must give the non-terminating party and all enrolled students no less than sixty days' notice. Termination may only occur at the end of an academic term. In addition, the terminating party must negotiate all terms of such termination with the non-terminating party to ensure that all students currently enrolled in the academic program or course(s) will be allowed to complete the academic requirements and/or be offered alternative academic courses that will allow the student(s) to complete the program. If termination will cause a negative impact on a student's successful completion of the academic program, the parties will work diligently to reduce such impact to a minimum.

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Appendix 1: Course Options that will fulfill UW-W General Education Requirements and Wisconsin State PI-34 Requirements

The courses listed on the following pages are not requirements to enter UW-W.

Also, please note that there may be other LCOOCC courses that will transfer to UW-W and fulfill graduation requirements. Those courses will be reviewed on a student specific basis. The lists below are not exhaustive, but are meant to provide students with a guide for suggestions of course selections.

For graduation from UW-W, students also need to take 8-12 credits of General Education electives from the Humanities, Arts, or Social Science sections. However, only 1 course from each UW-W subject prefix will be allowed to count.

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If a student chooses 1 course from these options, it will cover the General Education Humanities (GH) requirement.
