1. Purpose of Articulation Agreement

This articulation agreement establishes a cooperative relationship between the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater (UW-W) and College of Lake County (CLC), effective for students starting the Bachelor of Science in Education-Early Childhood Education in or after the spring 2022 term which will assist both schools to better serve the educational needs of transfer students.

Both institutions agree to maintain accreditation by the Higher Learning Commission and any other accreditation currently in existence pertaining to degree programs articulated via the transfer agreement.

Students transferring under the guidelines of this articulation agreement must:

- 1.1. successfully complete the Associate of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education degree program at College of Lake County
- 1.2. earn a cumulative GPA of a **2.75** (on a 4.0 scale), including coursework from other institutions (if appropriate), and according to UW-W repeat policy

- 1.3. have applied to and are successfully admitted into UW-W (*all UW-W application deadlines apply*) beginning spring 2022 and any subsequent terms

 - 1.3.1. declare a major of Early Childhood Education
 - 1.3.1.1. *students interested in ECE4U should indicate such in their personal statement portion of the electronic application; see section 6 below for course delivery descriptions*
 - 1.3.2. admission to UW-W does NOT guarantee admission to the professional program in the UW-W College of Education and Professional Studies. Admission into the UW-W College of Education and Professional Studies- Professional Education Program is based upon the student's successful completion of academic and nonacademic criteria determined by the College of Education and Professional Studies. 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3. University/General Education Requirements

- 3.1. The UW-W baccalaureate candidate must meet UW-W's Bachelor of Science in Education degree and graduation requirements, including general education requirements. <http://uww-public.courseleaf.com/undergraduate/education-professional-studies/#degreerequirementstext>
- 3.2. Elective courses taken or substituted at the sending institution and sending program not listed in this agreement will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and determined how they may apply to the degree at the receiving institution.
 - 3.2.1. Entering students may apply general education credits toward satisfying UW-W general education requirements as specified in Transferology: <https://www.transferology.com/school/uww>
- 3.3. Regardless of major, a minimum of 25% of the major course units and 25% of the minor course units must be completed at UW-W.
- 3.4. A minimum of 30 units of UW-W coursework is required to qualify for an undergraduate degree. At least 15 of these 30 units must be taken at UW-W immediately prior to graduation
- 3.5. The maximum number of credits that can be transferred from all two-year transfer institutions to UW-W is 72.

4. Admission to Professional Education

- 4.1. Admission to UW-W does NOT guarantee admission to the professional program in the UW-W College of Education and Professional Studies. Admission into the UW-W College of Education and Professional Studies- Professional Education Program is based upon the student's successful completion of academic and nonacademic criteria determined by the College of Education and Professional Studies. These criteria are as follows (also available on the Admission to Professional Education website):
 - 4.1. Completion of 30-degree credits (transferable credits and UW-W credits).
 - 4.2. 2.75 combined cumulative grade point average on transferable credits, or completion of an approved Applied Associate Degree in Early Childhood Education, or qualifying test scores.
 - 4.3. Completed applications and test scores (if applicable) must be submitted by the posted deadlines on the COEPS Admission: <https://www.uww.edu/coeps/advising-admissions/admissions#ECEProgramRequirements>



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5. Additional Conditions

- 5.1. Program to Program transfer courses/credits are accepted only for the degree specified in this agreement. **A change of major invalidates these courses/credits for transfer** unless they are approved within some other Program to Program Articulation Agreement for a different major at UW-W.
- 5.2. **Degree must be posted on official transcript** to receive credits from the agreement.
- 5.3. The UW-W and College of Lake County reserve the right to make policy and program changes, which could affect the content of this agreement, due to changes in the curriculum or quality standards at either institution.
- 5.4. Review and renewal of this agreement will be made at appropriate intervals.
- 5.5. The UW-W and College of Lake County agree to assist each other in appropriately promoting this agreement in their respective marketing materials, events, websites, and reports

6. Course Delivery Methods

6.1. On Campus Model

- 6.1.1. Apply for Admission to UWW for the fall semester and apply for Admission to the EC program during the fall semester to start the EC course sequence in the spring. This is a competitive admission process, accepting 30 students each year.

6.2. ECE4U Model

- 6.2.1. Apply for Admission to UWW and the EC program for the summer semester to start the EC course sequence in the summer. This is not a competitive process. Students with their AAS degree in early childhood education that meet all other requirements will be eligible.

7. Courses and Requirements Remaining to Degree

Once students are admitted they will be required to meet the following criteria to graduation and recommendation for licensure.

- 7.1 University Requirements: The general education university requirements may be found at the following website. <https://www.uww.edu/gened/requirements> Students may transfer in 72 credits, so some general education requirements may be taken at the WTC and transferred to UWW.

7.3 Other Requirements:

7.3.1: Students must earn a 2.75 Combined Cumulative GPA and Major GPA before student teaching and before graduation.

7.3.2: Students must take at least 30 credits at UWW to satisfy the residency requirement.

7.3.3: Students must earn a 3.0 in their Content Courses or pass the Praxis II with qualifying scores.
