Bachelor of Business Administration

Students at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater may declare a business major at any point in their studies, including their freshman year. Any student who meets the admission requirements is admitted to the College of Business and Economics. No separate application is required.

Admission

The minimum combined GPA requirement varies depending on the number of credits you have earned. To declare business major, the following minimum requirements must be met:

- Less than 24 credits = 2.0 combined GPA
- 24 + = 2.5 combined GPA

To progress towards completion of a business degree, students must have a minimum combined GPA of a 2.5 to register for the Business Core Requirements or any 300- or 400- level, business courses.

To register for the Business Core Requirements, students must complete the following:

- Must have a 2.5 combined cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale.
- Meet a course's specific course prerequisite (i.e. to take ACCOUNT 249, ACCOUNT 244 must be completed first).

Application

- Submit the following materials:
 - An official copy of your final high school transcript/GED/HSED
 - Official transcripts from any colleges or universities ever attended

Priority Deadlines:

- Fall: July 1st
- Spring: December 1st

Students are encouraged to apply at least one semester prior to intended start term at UW-Whitewater.

Calculation of Admission GPA

Grades from all transferable coursework will be used. Developmental transferrable coursework in English and Math is included. A repeated course grade will be used but only if the original grade is C- or lower. Please see the [UWW Repeat Policy](#) for more information regarding repeated courses.

Scholarships

Student's application for admission also serves as the scholarship application. Students must be admitted by April 1st to be considered for scholarships for the next fall semester start. Scholarship consideration is based on transfer GPA and credit amounts.

Special Notes

- Some UW-Whitewater colleges have a diversity course requirement as part of their degree requirements. See Guide below for details. Waukesha Co Technical College courses that satisfy the U.S. Racial/Ethnic Diversity college requirement are identified as DV.
- Programs that are offered 100% online can be found [here](#).
- **CLEP/AP Credit:** Subject exam scores and credit vary by score. Official test results must be sent directly to UWW for credit to be awarded for CLEP or AP.
- Transfer students can transfer up to 72 credits from all two-year institutions attended; students transferring in over 72 credits may exceed 120 credits needed for graduation

General Education Information

Students transferring **with** the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences Degree:

- CGER are satisfied with completion of an Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences degree from Waukesha Co Technical College.

Students transferring **without** the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences Degree:

- **Applied Associate degrees do not waive students from general education requirements.**
- Students who do not earn the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences degree before transferring will have their coursework evaluated on a course-by-course basis and may need to complete courses at UW-Whitewater if missing categories below
- Some majors require courses that serve as both degree requirements and satisfy CGER, especially in Business and Education majors. Please reach out to UW-Whitewater Transfer Admissions for more information

CORE classes:

- UW-Whitewater CGER requires students to take four of five multi-disciplinary courses: CORE 110; CORE 130; CORE 120 or 140; and CORE 390. Students transferring 15+ credits from WCTC may satisfy some of the CORE requirements with substitute courses as follows:
 - CORE 130 can be satisfied with an SBS-S or SBS-E course, as appropriate.
 - CORE 110 can be satisfied with an HA-A course, as appropriate.

This transfer guide is designed to assist students with their academic planning. Every effort is made to maintain accurate information; however, this information is subject to change as programs are updated. Students should contact the member institution to keep informed of changes, as final responsibility for verifying information rests with the student.

Additional BBA Transfer Information

All College of Business and Economics grade point average requirements refer to a "combined cumulative" GPA. This GPA computation includes your transfer credits and grades along with your UW-Whitewater credits and grades. This policy means that your transfer record contributes to determining whether you're eligible for all College of Business and Economics business courses (2.50 requirement) including freshman- and sophomore-level business courses, junior- and senior-level courses, and for graduation (2.50 requirement).

Regardless of the number of core courses you are required to take, you must meet the university common general education requirements (CGER) minimum of 35 units/credits and take the minimum in each area of CGER.

Your transfer institution may offer courses in a sequence that differs from the UW-Whitewater offerings. The most common examples of this discrepancy are in mathematics and economics. At UW-Whitewater, you will be required to complete finite mathematics unless you transfer in 8 or more credits of calculus (equivalents of UW-Whitewater's MATH 142 and MATH 151 or equivalent of UW-Whitewater MATH 152). UW-Whitewater also requires courses in both macroeconomics and microeconomics. If you complete microeconomics, you will still need to take macroeconomics, and vice versa.

College of Business and Economics accepts up to 6 credits of transfer courses towards major requirements (300-400 level courses).

All Business students must complete a course with significant international content. This can be satisfied by equivalent of UW-Whitewater BEINDP 200 or any course designated HA-G (except for 100 or 200 level world language courses).

Course equivalencies specified in this guide are subject to change in the event that the course curricula of relevant programs at Waukesha Co Technical College or at UW-Whitewater undergo revision.

This Transfer Guide is effective Fall2026 and shall be reviewed every three years.
