Vice-Chair Report: update on committees

Faculty Senate Liaison Report:

- One stop-shop at UC is open
- Peter Felton Relationship Rich Education will be on campus.
- Policy Review: There's been a policy on the books that system has decided we need to actually enforce. Any policies in personnel rules, constitutions, bylaws etc. hat tie to state statute have to go through review from UW system in the board of regents. It can be done passively or through an official channel. Essentially, what all of the campuses are having to do is submit to the board all of their personnel rules from all the governance groups. And then system legal has to go through it. There's a little bit right now of passing things in practice, but then having to wait for it to officially take effect. Essentially, unless it's house on fire, there will be a limiting of any changes to things like personnel rules this year.
- Faculty Review: Faculty yearly review is needed for pay plan because right now it essentially besides what
 they do at the very beginning then post tenure year review after that, they could go five years without
 any form of review.

Past Chair Report: enrollment update provided; We're ten students higher today than we were at the final census state numbers last year; 11522 is where we ended up last fall and right this morning the current numbers were ten students higher today than we were at the final census state numbers last year; it's looking like it'll be between one and a half and 2 % increase, which is about 200 students. Comparing across system, we are excellent. The most shocking changes have been in the three institutions that had the budget crisis last year.

- Windsor: PSAS, peoplesoft as a service; we're moving our server access from UW whitewater to Madison; that will be happening the weekend of the 20th; no one will have access to WINS, and it will be a slow rollout; so if students need to change around their classes, if they're trying to withdraw, etc., just as an FYI, it will impact your accessibility into the system. This is a major upgrade, but we were told we needed to go to Madison for this service and it will free up some server space; system wide shared service then being established which means customizations and requests will be limited.
- **Schanen:** City council will be in this room next Tuesday at 06:30. History supposedly has it that city council used to meet on campus once a year for a number of years and then that practice stopped. We'll be back here for at least probably at least one school year, if not twice.
