The course will explore the British and U.S. intelligence agencies' efforts at saving who they regarded as the savior of a nation in Asia during the Cold War. Beginning with an introduction to civilian intelligence organizations' history, the course will probe 6 most debatable operations led by the British and American agencies between the 1940s and the 1970s. As a required course for history majors' capstone requirement, students will attend the lectures on the historical background and primary sources and prep sessions for individual research paper for 13 weeks. In the last 2 weeks, students are to present their individual research projects in the class and submit a research paper.
