DIAGNOSTIC SERVICES

Clients are eligible to receive a comprehensive assessment of their oral and written communication skills as part of their semester's programming. The results are utilized as one source of information to drive intervention planning.

Clients ranging in age from approximately **18 months to 18 years** can receive therapy addressing the following:

- Speech sound disorders
- Phonology
- Oral and written language
- Fluency
- Social skills
- Executive functioning,
- Augmentative and alternative communication (AAC)

We also provide **preventative and/or strategy based intervention** for children and adolescents who are at risk of developing, or already have, academic difficulties in relation to their communication deficits.



In collaboration with certified speech-language pathologists and/or audiologists, graduate students conduct hearing screenings for children enrolled in public and private schools throughout southeastern Wisconsin.



INDIVIDUAL AND/OR GROUP SESSIONS

Individual and group treatment sessions for speech, language, and literacy therapy are scheduled throughout the week within the academic year (fall and spring semesters) based on client/clinician/supervisor/ room availability.
