Entrance Requirements:

Bachelor's Degree

A minimum of 2.75 overall as an undergraduate

Applicants for this program must have taken SPECED 606: Career and Vocational Programming for Students with Disabilities or the equivalent.

Note: Units earned in the Transitions Specialist Certificate Program may also count for the Master of Science in Education Degree Program in Special Education.
