



Acceptable Materials for Recycling





Paper

- Office paper (printer/copy paper, notebooks, folders)
- Flattened cardboard boxes (no food in pizza boxes!)
- Chip-board (dry food boxes)
- Newspapers
- Magazines and catalogs
- Paperback books and phone books
- Junk mail and envelopes (including window envelopes)
- Shredded paper (put in clear plastic bags)

Plastic

Containers, bottles and jugs — #1 through #7

Glass Containers (clear, green, and brown)

Aluminum Cans

Steel ("Tin") Cans

Do NOT Put in Recycle Bin:

- Any containers with a food/product still in it
- Thin plastic products: Plastic film, frozen dinner trays, plastic bags, lids, straws, packaging
- Broken glass
- Styrofoam containers
- Hazardous materials (fluorescent lights, needles/syringes, electronics, batteries, chemicals)
